The city is also known for a special type of curd.

Patan (Lalitpur) is one of the largest cities in Nepal. It is right across the Bagmati River from Kathmandu. Patan Durbar Square is also UNESCO World Heritage Sites inside Kathmandu Valley. It is a heart of Hindu and Buddhist culture, full of spiritual art, temples and monasteries. Patan Durbar Square offers the best Newari architecture meditation in the entire valley. There are more than 600 stupas in the charming narrow streets that surround the square.
